

**RESOLUTION NO. R-21-01**

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH "SUMMIT COUNTY SERVICE DEPARTMENT RESPONSE NETWORK" TO SHARE RESOURCES AND ASSIST EACH OTHER IN THE EVENT OF EMERGENCIES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

**WHEREAS**, over the past several weeks, the Summit County Executive and members of her team have had discussions with the Summit County Engineer, and many local mayors and township trustees concerning the potential impact of COVID-19 on public service operations within the county; and,

**WHEREAS**, in particular, snowplowing capabilities, has been an area of concern for many of our community leaders if public service departments are depleted by COVID-19; and,

**WHEREAS**, in an effort to be pro-active and offer one another additional support, certain Summit County Service Departments have formed the "Summit County Service Department Response Network" to share resources and to assist each other in the form of personnel, equipment, materials and supplies in the event of emergencies that disrupt service department services; and,

**WHEREAS**, Summit County has proposed a Memorandum of Understanding between member communities for the purpose of shared services and snowplowing; and,

**WHEREAS**, Council believes it is in the best interests of the Village to enter into the Memorandum of Understanding with the "Summit County Service Department Response Network" to participate in a program for Mutual Aid and Assistance with Summit County.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the Village of Clinton, Summit County, Ohio as follows:

**Section 1:** That the Mayor of the Village of Clinton is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with Summit County and/or other local political subdivisions, in a form substantially similar to the one attached as Exhibit "A" hereto.

**Section 2:** That the Mayor and Fiscal Officer are hereby authorized to sign and process all necessary paperwork to effectuate the entering of, execution and implementation of said agreement.

**Section 3:** That, to the extent not already done so, the funds required for the payment of the obligations incurred are hereby appropriated for the purposes described.


**Section 4:** That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.


**Section 5:** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in a duly noticed virtual, open meeting of this Council



**RESOLUTION NO. R-21-02**

**A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO REPLACE THE TAX LEVY AT THE TAX RATE OF 8.5 MILL AND REQUESTING THE SUMMIT COUNTY FISCAL OFFICER TO CERTIFY THE TOTAL CURRENT TAX VALUATION OF THE VILLAGE AND THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WOULD BE GENERATED BY THIS REPLACEMENT LEVY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY (FIRE LEVY).**

**WHEREAS**, this Council finds that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the Village and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of that limitation for the provision and maintenance of fire apparatus, mechanical resuscitators, underwater rescue and recovery equipment, or other fire equipment and appliances, buildings and sites therefor, or sources of water supply and materials therefor, for the establishment and maintenance of lines of fire-alarm communications, for the payment of firefighting companies or permanent, part-time, or volunteer firefighting, emergency medical service, administrative, or communications personnel to operate the same, including the payment of any employer contributions required for such personnel under Section 145.48 or 742.34 of the Revised Code, for the purchase of ambulance equipment, for the provision of ambulance, paramedic, or other emergency medical services operated by a fire department or firefighting company, or for the payment of other related costs Village of Clinton under Section 5705.19(I) of the Ohio Revised Code; and,

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Section 5705.03(B) of the Ohio Revised Code, in order to submit the question of a renewal tax levy pursuant to Section 5705.25 of the Ohio Revised Code, this Council must request that the Summit County Fiscal Officer certify (i) the total current valuation of the Village, and, (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the levy; and,

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with Section 5705.03(B) of the Ohio Revised Code, upon receipt of a certified copy of the resolution of this Council declaring the necessity of the tax, stating its purpose, stating whether it is an additional levy, a renewal or a replacement of an existing tax, noting the section of the Ohio Revised Code pursuant to which its submission to the electors is authorized, this Council desires to request the County Fiscal Officer to certify the total current tax valuation of the Village, and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed levy.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the Village of Clinton, Summit County, Ohio, two-thirds of the members elected therefore concurring that:


**Section 1:** This Council declares that it is necessary to have a replacement tax levied, for a period of five (5) years, of 8.5 mill ad valorem property tax outside of the ten mill limitation for the purpose of providing the capital needs of and maintaining the operations of the fire department in the Village of Clinton under Section 5705.19(I) of the Ohio Revised Code, specifically, for the provision and maintenance of fire apparatus, mechanical resuscitators,

**Section 10:** This Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health, safety and welfare of the Village's resident and to comply with the timing requirements of the Ohio Revised Code regarding the levying of taxes outside the 10 mill limitations and shall take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.



**RESOLUTION NO. R-21-03 (AMENDED)**

**A Resolution Adopting the Plan under the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Program Administered by the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Board of Participation by "eligible employees" of the Village of Clinton, Summit County, Ohio and declaring it an emergency.**

**Adoption of a Plan under the Program by Eligible Employer**

This Resolution has been approved as to form by the Ohio Attorney General

**WHEREAS**, Ohio Revised Code Section 148 (the "Enabling Statute") creates the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Board (the "Board") and establishes the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Program (the "Program") and a copy of the uniform Plan Document for the Program has been provided to the appropriate officer(s) of the Village of Clinton; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Clinton is an employer of "Eligible Employee(s) (as defined by Ohio Revised Code 148.01 (A) (1)), and thereby may adopt a Plan under the Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Clinton desires to or is required to adopt the Plan under the Program for participation by "eligible employees."

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the Council of the Village of Clinton hereby resolves as follows:

The Village of Clinton hereby adopts the Plan under the Program, and shall properly contract with any Eligible Employee who desires to participate in the Plan. The Village of Clinton's Plan shall be in the uniform Plan as promulgated by and as amended from time to time by the Board.

The Board is hereby authorized to administer the Plan under the Program, and to do all things necessary or proper for the administration of the Plan, consistent with the Enabling Statutes and all the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Board, whether by the Ohio Administrative Code or otherwise, and consistent with the Adoption Agreement executed by the Village of Clinton.

The Mayor of the Village of Clinton is hereby appointed the Responsible Official who is authorized and directed by the Council of the Village of Clinton to execute the Adoption Agreement.

Consistent with the Adoption Agreement and the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Board, the proper officials, officers, employees, and agents of the Village of Clinton are authorized to provide the Board with any information it may properly require for the administration of the Plan under the Program.

**Section 3:** That this Ordinance is in the best interests and public safety of the Village of Clinton and its residents.


