Village of Clinton Regular Council Meeting

Tuesday, December 20, 2022

Council President Kent Goch called the meeting to order on Tuesday, December 20, 2022, at 7:00 PM in Clinton Village Hall. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Jared McDaniel and recited by those present.

Council Members present: Janice Godwin, Ellen Conroy, Matt Steiner, Marissa Gensimore and Kent Goch. Mayor Bud McDaniel and Councilman Lewis Rash were absent.

Others Present: Leah Weirick, Fiscal Officer; Fire Chief Wayne Conroy; Diane Gunter and Jared McDaniel, residents.

Approval of Council Minutes

Mrs. Godwin made a motion to approve the December 6, 2022, Council meeting minutes, second by Mrs. Conroy.

Roll call: Gensimore, Goch, Godwin, Conroy and Steiner voted yes. Motion passed.

Council Communications and Council Committee Reports

Mrs. Gensimore stated that she contacted Eric Burns of Independent Energy Consultants. He will email what their contract would look like. We are working on a date when he could attend a council meeting. He said be careful about people giving quotes on what the rates would be now, because the agreement rate may be different.

Matt Steiner asked about where we are getting the \$40,000 from that was noted in the December 6, 2022 minutes. Mrs. Weirick said there was money left over from the budget of this year as we didn't use to purchase salt and Kevin did not opt to take healthcare insurance which is about \$16,000. We were not appropriating anymore but using funds that were budgeted that we didn't use for other things.

Mr. Goch said the mileage is terrible on the one-ton truck, a V-10 and there are no job boxes on it. Should we get job boxes on the one-ton? Mr. Steiner also brought up the fire department's pick up. May make sense for the fire department to sell the street department their pickup truck.

Mr. White provided council with his research on a truck he found. He indicated if anything happens to the one ton, he does not have another vehicle to use.

Mrs. Weirick said we do everything on a cash basis. Mr. White could just start using it and move funds from our General Fund to the Fire Department fund and make changes on our insurance policy. The cost would be fair market value. The fire department also wants to sell the Explorer unless they Street Department takes possession of the pickup.

The legal service contract that is in the legislation for tonight did increase. It's \$160 an hour now, and is going up to \$180 an hour in 2023 and \$190 in 2024.
